

Summer is here, and so is hurricane season, which began on June 1 and will end on November 30. I am reminding all our residents to plan and prepare ahead of time. It's never too early to prepare! Leading up to hurricane season, you have heard this many times before. Now is the time to start thinking about how you and your family would react if a storm threatened our City.

Please plan to have ready-to-eat non-perishable food items, a battery-powered flashlight, battery-powered radio, a first aid kit and a reserve of prescription medicine.

Also, now is a good time to trim trees, shrubs and other landscaping to minimize vegetative debris on your property. Be sure to assess your home for vulnerable spots and check the condition of shutters and backup generators.

Look out for communications from my office with a more robust hurricane preparedness plan that you and your neighbors can use as a guide.

On another note, residents are reminded to prepare to apply for our Minor Home

Repair Program. The application window opens on Aug. 14, 2023, at 8 a.m. The owner-occupied Minor Home Repair Program will assist homeowners with home repairs to correct health and safety hazards, as well as address any building or code deficiencies of owner-occupied properties. 


ENROLL IN COMMUNITY CONNECT TODAY!

According to the American Red Cross, nearly 358,500 structural fires occur annually in the United States. What if there was a free way to enhance the response of firefighters dispatched to emergency calls at your home or business? That's where Community Connect comes in.

Community Connect is a national program now offered by Tamarac Fire Rescue (TFR). It allows participants to provide information about their households and properties to help firefighters respond more strategically to their unique needs.

Residents and business owners can provide floor plans, special instructions, announce the presence of pets, medical conditions and any other relevant details that could be beneficial during a TFR response. The information shared is accessible only to participating fire departments in the event of an emergency.



Another aspect of the program is that users can provide Tamarac Fire Rescue with a key to their home or business. Keys can be securely stored in case of an emergency, allowing firefighters to quickly access buildings without breaking through windows and doors. The key is typically stored in lockboxes, accessible only to authorized personnel.

Participation in Community Connect is not required, but strongly encouraged by TFR. The program provides an additional layer of security and peace of mind. There are currently 86 residents and businesses participating in the program.

In 2014, he was promoted to Sergeant, serving in the Road Patrol and Civil divisions. In 2019, Captain Cooper was promoted to Road Patrol Lieutenant and contributed to enhancements in team building and operational procedures.

Cooper is no stranger to Tamarac. In March 2021, he became Tamarac's Executive Officer, providing leadership to more than 100 employees, overseeing daily administrative and patrol functions, and engaging with elected officials for overall community and agency success. Cooper says the most exciting aspects of serving in Tamarac are the highly engaged residents. "This gives BSO-Tamarac a unique opportunity to continue elevating our relationship with residents and businesses and to expand established District initiatives like Welcome Home and Coffee With

A Cop, while also introducing innovative new strategies like the P.E.A.C.E. Initiative," said Cooper. P.E.A.C.E. stands for Public Education and Community Engagement. It's the District slogan instituted by Cooper to encompass the community forged through education and engagement between BSO-Tamarac and City's residents.

As a self-described "servant-leader," throughout his career, Cooper has maintained a passion for mentoring and helping others accomplish their career goals. He finds great pride in seeing several past mentees elevated to the ranks of sergeant and lieutenant, along with roles in several specialized units within BSO. GREEN SCENE

With hurricane season underway, regular catch basin maintenance is critical. It keeps debris from entering our sewer system and helps protect streets and yards from flooding. Tamarac's Public Services Department maintains the City's catch basins to maximize the performance of our drainage system; but we must all do our part.



To protect Tamarac's local water resources, let's be mindful of what enters these drains, as they flow directly into our lakes and canals, not to the wastewater treatment plant. Pollutants like motor oil, dirt and fertilizer can impact water quality, along with plant and animal life in our ecosystem. Rainwater can pick up these pollutants and carry them into catch basins.

Here are a few ways to help keep local catch basins clean:

- Compost or bag yard clippings.
- Keep storm drainage inlets free of trash, debris or other obstructions.
- Never discard paint, oil or other hazardous waste into storm drains.

Homeowners associations (HOA) are responsible for maintaining the catch basins in communities with private streets. Residents living in neighborhoods with an HOA may contact their association's board to report issues within their community.

The City of Tamarac is excited to announce the debut of 12 new public art sculptures along Inspiration Way! Located on Nob Hill Road, between Commercial Boulevard and McNab Road, the City’s “Museum Without Walls” includes temporary sculpture installations that promote appreciation of fine art and enhance outdoor spaces.

The City’s public art is paid for through developer fees on new construction and sometimes grants. It’s administered by residents serving on the Public Art Committee, with the support of the Tamarac City Commission.






