

Commission Editorial Vice Mayor Marlon Bolton, District 1

We have made lots of progress over the years, putting a much-deserved focus on eastern Tamarac, and listening to the needs of our residents.

Anyone who drives by the Shaker Village Community in eastern Tamarac can see an abandoned clubhouse in disrepair. It is an eyesore that disrupts community pride. An independent Eastside Park Feasibility Study was conducted in 2017, to address the disparity in the inequitable distribution of City services between the east and the west sides of town. The study concluded that the eastside of Tamarac severely lacks resources and facilities, and that residents of east Tamarac, District 1, were underserved.

The study also identified several ways the City could enhance resources and facilities for the eastside of Tamarac. One of the recommendations included acquiring the clubhouse at Shaker Village and transforming it into a state-of-the-art community center for all of the City's residents.

The City Commission, by a majority vote, agreed to acquire the property at Shaker Village. Once

the City acquires the property, it will be available for use by the public.

Subject to an agreeable shared use agreement, the dilapidated building will be gone, community pride restored, an improved Commercial Boulevard will emerge and a public facility will be built to benefit you.

More major projects are slated for District 1. Almost complete are the barrier walls along Prospect Road, improvements to the Prospect Road corridor and Caporella Park. I am also pleased to announce that the Sabal Palm Park, in Central Parc project, and the repaving of the streets in Mainlands 1-5 will start soon.



WHEN TO STOP FOR SCHOOL BUSES

Children gathered at bus stops around town serve as evidence that school is back in session. This also signals drivers to take extra precautions as children load and unload from school buses.

Drivers, remember to keep your guard up and stay aware by keeping a keen eye out for school zones, monitoring your speed and eliminating distractions like cell phones. Don't forget, those flashing red lights and the stop sign-arm indicate when school buses are ready to pick-up or drop-off children. Remind your children to cross in front of the bus after exiting, as recommended by Broward Sheriff's Office.



Sticking to the assigned spots during drop-offs and pick-ups keeps traffic flowing smoothly. BSO also recommends that bus-bound youngsters wait curbside and stand 6 to 9 feet away from the road.

GREEN SCENE

Conserving natural resources is crucial for the future of our planet.

Here are few helpful water conservation tips:

- Limit watering your yard to a maximum of 1-inch per week. Over-watering can lead to issues like fungal growth, diseases, and shallow, compacted root systems vulnerable to drought and foot traffic.
- Water your lawn during early morning hours to reduce water evaporation, minimize the risk of fungal diseases and to ensure your lawn has ample moisture for daily growth.

Common Code Violations

- **Zoning Violations:** Ensuring compliance with land use regulations, setbacks, signage restrictions, and business permits.
- **Noise and Nuisance:** Promoting peaceful neighborhoods by addressing excessive noise, illegal parking, and other disruptive activities.
- **Health and Safety:** Addressing concerns related to building code violations, fire hazards, unsanitary conditions, and pest infestations.

The City is dedicated to preserving the safety, cleanliness, and aesthetic appeal of our community. By working together, we can ensure a vibrant and thriving community for everyone to enjoy.

COOKING SAFETY STARTS WITH YOU

October is Fire Prevention Month, a time dedicated to raising awareness about fire safety and educating the public about how to prepare for and prevent emergencies.


The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) recognizes Oct. 8 - 14 as Fire Prevention Week. This year's theme, "Cooking safety starts with YOU! Pay attention to fire prevention," aims to educate the public about emergencies and essential steps to help reduce the risk of fire when cooking at home. It also emphasizes ways to keep yourself and those around you safer.

NFPA reports that cooking is the primary cause of home fires and home fire injuries, with 49% involving cooking equipment. Data also indicates that cooking was the sole major fire cause that resulted in more fires and fire deaths during 2014-2018, compared to 1980-1984.

Below are three safety tips to follow when cooking:

- Keep a close eye on what you're cooking. Set timers for foods with longer cooking, simmering or baking times.
- Remove combustible items and keep anything that can burn, such as dish towels, oven mitts, food packaging and paper towels from the cooking area.
- Turn pot handles away from the stove's front. Keep a pot lid nearby while cooking. If a small grease fire ignites, slide the lid over the pan and turn off the burner promptly to smother the flames.
