# TAMARAC FIRE RESCUE'S INNOVATIVE FALL PREVENTION INITIATIVE

As the nation's aging population grows, more people are living longer and, in many cases, living independently. This trend brings both opportunities and challenges, particularly in health and safety. One of the most significant risks older adults face is the danger of falls, which can result in severe injuries and impact overall well-being. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, one in three older adults will experience a fall, leading to nearly 3 million emergency department visits in the United States alone.

Data from the National Fire Protection Association shows that services' role has shifted as they now attend to more falls than fires among older adults. Tamarac Fire Rescue recognized this trend after responding to more than 1,100 slip-and-fall calls in 2023. To reduce these incidents, Tamarac Fire Rescue launched a safety initiative to distribute slip-resistant socks to City residents.

Stop by the second floor of Fire Station 15, 6000 Hiatus Road, to receive your free pair of socks.

Additionally, falling in the home could lead to costly repairs if forced entry is needed. The Knox HomeBox is a possible solution as it allows first responders to enter the home quickly, makes re-securing property easier and faster, and reduces forced entry property damage. 

# CONNECTING FOR SAFETY: TAMARAC'S PARTNERSHIP WITH BSO EMPOWERS BUSINESSES AND RESIDENTS WITH REAL-TIME CRIME PREVENTION

**T**he Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) wants to increase its Public Private Partnership (PPP) with the businesses and homes in the City of Tamarac. This partnership enables businesses and residents to integrate their CCTV systems with BSO's Real-Time Crime Center (RTCC). By doing so, BSO can access live video feeds from these locations, enhancing their ability to solve crimes and apprehend criminals effectively. Listed below are some of the benefits to integrating your surveillance systems with BSO's RTCC.

**Integration of Surveillance Systems:** The PPP allows businesses and homeowners to connect their surveillance cameras to BSO's Real-Time Crime Center. This integration provides law enforcement with immediate access to live video feeds, which can be instrumental in responding to incidents quickly.

**Enhanced Crime Prevention:** By having access to real-time videos from various locations, BSO can monitor neighborhoods and commercial areas more effectively. This capability helps deter crime and allows for swift action during incidents, improving overall community safety.

**Community Engagement:** The program encourages collaboration between the BSO and local businesses and residents. By participating, community members can play a proactive role in their safety and contribute to a network of surveillance that aids law enforcement efforts.

**Access to Resources:** The partnership provides businesses and residents with information on **approved** vendors who can install compatible equipment. This ensures that the technology used is effective and meets the standards set by the BSO.




## VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT




# NEW COMMUNICATION BOARD PROMOTES INCLUSIVITY

# RUTH BADER GINSBURG COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN: EMPOWERING TAMARAC

**T**he Ruth Bader Ginsburg Commission on the Status of Women (RBG Commission) was created by the Tamarac City Commission in 2021 with a clear mission: to identify and address “economic, health and wellness, social, and other issues concerning women’s lives through education and advocacy in the City of Tamarac.”

The Commission’s current members include Chair Janice Haywood (District 1), Rachel Scott (District 2), Natalee Clark-Richards (District 3), Linda Danner (District 4), and Patti Lynn (Mayor-At-Large).

The Commission is named in honor of the late Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, a trailblazer who became the second woman appointed to the U.S. Supreme Court in 1993. During her 27 years on the bench, Justice Ginsburg championed women’s rights, shaping a legacy of equality and justice through her rulings and opinions.

In 2023, the RBG Commission launched the annual Women’s History Month Recognition program, held each March to coincide with Women’s History Month. This program highlights the achievements of Tamarac women who have significantly impacted their community. Honorees are recognized for their exceptional dedication to serving others, often going above and beyond the scope of their roles. The Mayor and each district selects one woman to be honored during a City Commission meeting in March.

Beyond these recognitions, the RBG Commission actively represents Tamarac at various community events. Most recently, members attended the second annual Women in Pink Luncheon, hosted by the Tamarac North Lauderdale Chamber of Commerce. During the event, the Commission celebrated Sallie James for her outstanding volunteer work as a Guardian Ad Litem for the 17th Circuit in Broward County.

Nominations are now open for the 2025 Women’s History Month Recognition program. If you know a woman from your district who exemplifies service and leadership, consider nominating her. Contact the Mayor, your Commissioner or the RBG

Commission member representing your district to submit a nomination.

Justice Ginsburg once said, “*Women belong in all places where decisions are being made. It shouldn’t be that women are the exception.*” The RBG Commission continues to uphold her legacy by ensuring Tamarac women have a platform to shine and make a difference.
