As I look back on the past year, I remain grateful to represent our fantastic City! Whether it's been attending our wonderful community events, serving on County and State boards, or meeting residents and businesspeople for coffee and conversation, it has been a great year!

It has been another year of achievements and awards for our City to celebrate! Here are just a few:

- Tamarac was ranked by Consumer Affairs as the fifth-best place to move to in Florida in 2025! Our population growth of 11.8% between 2018 and 2023, combined with the highest home appreciation of the top five locations between 2022 and 2023, also earned our City first place in the Economy category.
- Tamarac Fire Rescue continues to win awards individually and as a team, and this year was awarded their second consecutive 5-year accreditation from the Commission on Fire Accreditation International, which administers one of the most comprehensive fire service evaluations ever developed!
- The City of Tamarac won its third award in three years from the Florida League of Mayors! This year it was for the Municipal Innovation Awards in the **"Service Delivery Improvement"** category for the City's project *Transforming Municipal Service Delivery* project. Since the inception of the FLM Awards Program, the City of Tamarac is the only City to be an award recipient three years in a row! We received this honor in 2023 for the Tamarac Pet Pantry, in 2024 for the Shine Tamarac Campaign, and now in 2025 for Tamarac's Omni-Channel Call Center Solution.

Commission Editorial Vice Mayor Kicia Daniel, District 4





This past summer, District 2 was alive with energy, progress, and a deep sense

of community pride. On July 20th, Island SPACE hosted the **HERS 2025 event**, celebrating *Honorably Exceptional Regal Sisters* for their outstanding contributions. During the event, a donation was presented on behalf of District 2 in support of their continued empowerment work.

Fitness and wellness took center stage as I hosted several community events at the **Tamarac Village Amphitheater**, including *Feel the Rhythm* on July 19th, *Tamarac Sweat Fest* on August 23rd, and *Fête n' Flex* on August 30th. These events brought residents together for movement, fun, and community connection. We look forward to bringing more fitness events as well as Food Truck Fridays to the Tamarac Village Amphitheater!

We also proudly recognized **Millennium 6-12 Collegiate Academy** for their incredible academic achievement—earning the distinction of being ranked the **#1 high school in Broward County Public Schools** by *U.S. News & World Report*. In celebration of this milestone, a **\$10,000 donation** was awarded to the school using the District 2 Discretionary Funds—an investment in our youth and a commitment to educational excellence in District 2.

Capital Improvement Project

Our city is undergoing an exciting transformation, one project at a time. From vibrant mural installations to road improvements, the City of Tamarac is bringing new life to neighborhoods and public areas across the community.

Recent Projects

Streets across the city are brighter and more vibrant thanks to infrastructure enhancements



and public art that celebrates Tamarac's cultural diversity. A key initiative, the NW 94th Avenue Crosswalk & Roadway Drainage Improvements Project, is improving pedestrian safety and accessibility near Challenger Elementary and Millennium 6-12 Collegiate Academy. Scheduled for completion in Fall 2025, this project will enhance mobility and safety for students and residents alike.

Future Projects

Looking ahead, major projects are on the horizon. The Pine Island Road Improvement Project will expand the corridor from four to six lanes between Commercial Blvd and McNab Road. It includes a 12-foot multi-use path, improved crossings, and better lighting. Construction is set to begin in 2028.

Another exciting initiative, the Gateway Landscape Improvements Project, includes new landscaping, decorative pavers, irrigation systems, and upgraded medians—bringing the City's Go-Forward Roadway Landscape Master Plan to life. District 2 is home to the first of three locations of the project along Pine Island Road and Commercial Boulevard.

These efforts are all part of Tamarac's mission to create a safer, more welcoming, and more vibrant community. As these improvements continue, we invite everyone to get involved!

CHANGE YOUR CLOCK, CHANGE YOUR BATTERIES



As the year comes to a close, we'd like to remind everyone that daylight saving time ends on Sunday, November 2. When you set your clocks back, remember to replace the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. Smoke and carbon monoxide alarms should be tested monthly and replaced every 10 years. Homes should have smoke alarms in each bedroom and in the immediate vicinity outside each room.



Homes with fuel-burning appliances or attached garages need carbon monoxide alarms.

The holiday season is a time for gathering, celebrating and sharing meals, but it also brings an increased risk of cooking-related fires. As kitchens heat up with festive activity, it's important to stay alert and practice safe cooking practices. Tamarac Fire Rescue urges residents to take precautions to prevent fires and protect their homes and loved ones during the busiest cooking season of the year.

Cooking Fire Statistics*

- Tamarac Fire Rescue responded to more than 35 cooking-related calls in 2024.
- Clothing is the item first ignited in less than 1% of home cooking fires, but clothing ignitions caused 8% of home cooking fire deaths.
- Ranges or cooktops account for 53% of home cooking fire incidents.
- Unattended cooking is a factor in 29% of reported home cooking fires and half of the associated deaths.

* Based on 2017-2021 annual averages.

What you should know about home cooking safety

- Stay alert. Don't cook if you're sleepy or have consumed alcohol.
- Always remain in the kitchen when cooking. Use a timer to reduce the chances of burning your food.
- Keep anything that can catch fire — oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels and curtains away from your stovetop.
- Never throw water on an oil fire

If you have a cooking fire

- Get out! Close the door behind you to help contain the fire and call 9-1-1.
- Keep a lid nearby to smother small grease fires. Smother the fire by sliding the lid over the pan and turning the stove off. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled.
- For oven fires, turn off the heat and keep the door closed.

With the holidays upon us, we'd like to remind residents how to recycle waste accumulated during the season properly.

DO:

Recycle uncontaminated cardboard, paper boxes, cards and envelopes. Save bows, ribbons, gift boxes, gift bags and even wrapping paper for future use. Consider using reusable tote bags, brown paper bags or eye-catching magazines or newspaper pages as wrapping material. You can also get creative by crafting personalized and recyclable gift wrap using craft paper, markers or crayons.

DON'T:

Remember that string lights, artificial trees, foam packaging, tinsel, ribbons, bows, gift bags, tissue paper and wrapping paper are not recyclable.

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING:

Give your Christmas tree a new life by repurposing it! From Friday, December 26 - Sunday, January 18, bring your undecorated tree to Tamarac Public Services, 6011 Nob Hill Rd., where it will be chopped into mulch for City landscaping projects. Undecorated trees can also be placed curbside on your regularly scheduled bulk trash pick-up day to ensure they are disposed of in an environmentally friendly manner.
